

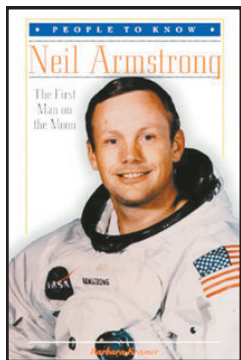
# THE READING ZONE
